HOW TO FIND US

- From the High Street: go down Gandy Street, turn right at the end and walk up the hill.
- From the clock tower: walk down Queen Street with Central Station on your left, turn left after the museum and walk up the hill.
- Coming out of the library: turn right down the ramp, right again at the bottom and walk about 75 metres straight on.

Accessibility

Exeter Phoenix building has ramped access to the left of the building leading to automatic doors, a lift, accessible WCs and two disabled parking spaces. There is a very steep slope from the street leading up to the main entrance and a flight of steps to the front door. If you have mobility issues and are arriving by taxi it is advisable to get dropped off at the side ramp, left of the main entrance.

Directions

- On Foot:

From the High Street: Turn off the High Street opposite the House of Fraser store, into the narrow alley called Gandy Street. Go to the end of Gandy Street, then turn right into Bradninch Place.

From Queen Street and Exeter Central Station Head away from the clock tower, with Central station on your left. Turn left after the Royal Albert Museum, walk up along the side of the museum in Upper Paul Street and Exeter Phoenix is at the top of the slope.

- By Bus:

Ask to be let off on Queen Street, as close to the Royal Albert Memorial Museum as possible. From there, walk along Queen Street and turn up Upper Paul Street and then up a slope to Exeter Phoenix.

- By Train:

Exeter is well served by trains from London, Bristol, Taunton, Plymouth and Torbay. The closest station to Exeter Phoenix is Exeter Central, platforms fully accessible by lifts. St David's station is mainline and accessible, but is a 15 minute walk up a hill to the city centre, so transfer to an Exeter Central train, bus or taxi to Queen Street if possible.

- By Car:

Please note that there is one disabled parking space at Exeter Phoenix but no other parking available. Please use city centre car parks.

From the East:

The A30 joins the M5 at junction 29. For Honiton Road Park & Ride continue on the A30 under the M5. If driving into the city follow the Honiton Road. After a couple of miles you will see Exeter Central Police Station on your right. Continue over the next roundabout into Paris Street. Carry along Paris Street, past the High Street, onto New North Road and past the prison. Take a left at the clock tower roundabout onto Queen Street and go past the Royal Albert Memorial Museum. Follow signs and park in the city centre car parks Walk up along the side of the museum in Upper Paul Street and you will find Exeter Phoenix ahead of you.

From the South (A38/A380):

Follow the A38 or A380 towards Exeter. For Matford Park & Ride leave the A38 at junction with A379 and follow signs. If driving into the city centre, continue to Junction 31 and turn onto A30 Westbound, follow for approximately two miles. Turn off 1st left marked Exeter and Crediton A377 and follow instructions for visitors from the West.

From the West (A30):

Proceed towards Exeter on the A30 from Okehampton. Turn off at junction before the M5 marked Exeter and Crediton A377. Follow the signs for A377, which will take you past Exeter St David's Station. Just beyond St David's Station, turn right on at the double roundabout and carry up St David's Hill bearing left at the next roundabout onto Hele Road. You will pass Exeter College on your left. At the lights, turn right onto Queen Street and go straight at the clock tower roundabout. Go past Exeter Central train station and the Royal Albert Memorial Museum. Follow signs and park in the city centre car parks Walk up along the side of the museum in Upper Paul Street and you will find Exeter Phoenix ahead of you.

From the North (M5):

From the M5 southbound use Junction 29 for Honiton Road Park & Ride or if driving into the City Centre follow instructions as for A30 East, from junction 29.
